JUAN CISCOMANI VOTED FOR OVER \$1 TRILLION IN HEALTH CARE CUTS

Now Arizonans are losing coverage, facing higher costs, and watching access to care disappear across Southeast Arizona.

Last year, **Juan Ciscomani** voted with **Donald Trump** to slash over **\$1 trillion** from Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act to pay for lavish tax cuts for billionaires and big corporations. New Medicaid eligibility limits will kick millions off coverage, while funding restrictions rip away money from hospitals, clinics, and nursing homes. They also ended the ACA premium tax credits that made coverage affordable for 22 million people – forcing working families to absorb skyrocketing premiums.

In AZ-06, **two facilities are closing** after Juan Ciscomani's vote sparked a health care crisis. For many Arizonans, getting care means traveling farther, waiting longer, paying more – or going without it altogether. While Ciscomani campaigns with Donald Trump, Arizonans across southeast Arizona are struggling to pay their bills and access the care they need.

Juan Ciscomani claimed the nearly \$1 trillion in Medicaid cuts he voted for would “protect its solvency.”

The reality tells a very different story.

THE PREMIUM SHOCK

FAMILIES ARE PAYING THOUSANDS MORE EVERY YEAR

For Arizonans who buy their own coverage, the premium spikes are staggering:

45-year-old \$64,000 INCOME	+\$1,773 INCREASE	\$7,213 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
60-year-old couple \$85,000 INCOME	+\$19,890 INCREASE	\$27,115 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
Family of four \$130,000 INCOME	+\$9,361 INCREASE	\$20,411 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
