REPUBLICANS VOTED FOR OVER \$1 TRILLION IN HEALTH CARE CUTS

Now Floridians are losing coverage, facing higher costs, and watching access to care disappear across Central Florida.

Last year, **Republicans voted with Donald Trump** to slash over **\$1 trillion** from Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act to pay for lavish tax cuts for billionaires and big corporations. New Medicaid eligibility limits will kick millions off coverage, while funding restrictions rip away money from hospitals, clinics, and nursing homes. They also ended the ACA premium tax credits that made coverage affordable for 22 million people – forcing working families to absorb skyrocketing premiums.

In FL-07, a health care provider is already closing after Republicans voted to create this crisis. For many Floridians, getting care means traveling farther, waiting longer, paying more – or going without it altogether. What Republicans sold as a victory is fast becoming a health care catastrophe across Central Florida.

Florida Republicans claimed the bill they voted for “protect[s] American families.”
The reality tells a very different story.

THE PREMIUM SHOCK

FAMILIES ARE PAYING THOUSANDS MORE EVERY YEAR

For Floridians who buy their own coverage, the premium spikes are staggering:

45-year-old \$64,000 INCOME	+\$3,821 INCREASE	\$9,261 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
60-year-old couple \$85,000 INCOME	+\$27,586 INCREASE	\$34,811 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
Family of four \$130,000 INCOME	+\$15,154 INCREASE	\$26,204 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
