SCOTT PERRY VOTED FOR OVER \$1 TRILLION IN HEALTH CARE CUTS

Now Pennsylvanians are losing coverage, facing higher costs, and watching access to care disappear across South Central Pennsylvania.

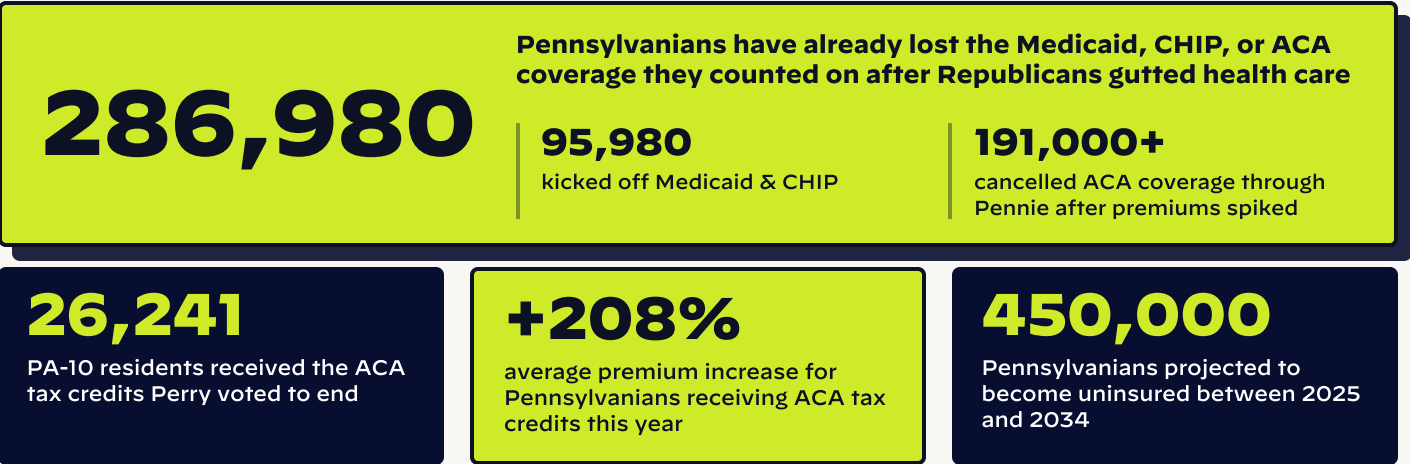
Last year, **Scott Perry voted with Donald Trump** to slash over **\$1 trillion** from Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act to pay for lavish tax cuts for billionaires and big corporations. New Medicaid eligibility limits will kick millions off coverage, while funding restrictions rip away money from hospitals, clinics, and nursing homes. They also ended the ACA premium tax credits that made coverage affordable for 22 million people – forcing working families to absorb skyrocketing premiums.

In South Central Pennsylvania, a health care facility is already at risk after Scott Perry’s vote sparked this crisis. For many Pennsylvanians, getting care means traveling farther, waiting longer, paying more – or going without it altogether. While Perry rubs elbows with JD Vance and the Trump administration, Pennsylvanians are struggling to pay their bills and access the care they need.

Scott Perry claimed the bill he voted for “increases” Medicaid funding.
The reality tells a very different story.

THE PREMIUM SHOCK

FAMILIES ARE PAYING THOUSANDS MORE EVERY YEAR

For Pennsylvanians who buy their own coverage, the premium spikes are staggering:

45-year-old \$64,000 INCOME	+\$811 INCREASE	\$6,251 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
60-year-old couple \$85,000 INCOME	+\$16,271 INCREASE	\$23,496 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
Family of four \$130,000 INCOME	+\$6,637 INCREASE	\$17,687 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM

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There's really no way to prepare for it – how do you suddenly come up with \$15,000 more a year? My husband can't work more, he has a head injury, and I work full time caring for my daughter. Something has to give, and it's going to be health care. People are going to lose their homes.

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A family plan through my work would cost \$800 per pay period, and a marketplace plan with a high deductible about \$650 a month. Right now I can't pay for it – it's just astronomical. I'm in my 40s going through perimenopause and can't talk to anyone about my symptoms because it's all unaffordable.
