ROB WITTMAN VOTED FOR OVER \$1 TRILLION IN HEALTH CARE CUTS

Now Virginians are losing coverage, facing higher costs, and watching access to care disappear across central and eastern Virginia.

Last year, **Rob Wittman voted with Donald Trump** to slash over **\$1 trillion** from Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act to pay for lavish tax cuts for billionaires and big corporations. New Medicaid eligibility limits will kick millions off coverage, while funding restrictions rip away money from hospitals, clinics, and nursing homes. They also ended the ACA premium tax credits that made coverage affordable for 22 million people – forcing working families to absorb skyrocketing premiums.

In central and eastern Virginia, hospitals Wittman’s constituents rely on are at risk of cuts or closure thanks to the GOP health care crisis. For many Virginians, getting care means traveling farther, waiting longer, paying more – or going without it altogether. While Wittman campaigns with Donald Trump’s backing, Virginians are struggling to pay their bills and access the care they need.

Rob Wittman told party leadership he wouldn’t support the “Big Beautiful Bill” over its Medicaid cuts – then folded and voted for it anyway.

The reality tells a very different story.

THE PREMIUM SHOCK

FAMILIES ARE PAYING THOUSANDS MORE EVERY YEAR

For Virginians who buy their own coverage, the premium spikes are staggering:

45-year-old \$64,000 INCOME	+\$783 INCREASE	\$6,223 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
60-year-old couple \$85,000 INCOME	+\$16,169 INCREASE	\$23,394 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
Family of four \$130,000 INCOME	+\$6,560 INCREASE	\$17,160 NEW ANNUAL PREMIUM
